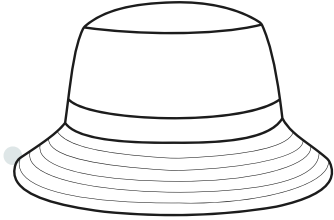

Key Dates:

Semester 2 (July–Dec 2026) vouchers available now (opened 1 July 2026)

Semester 1 (Jan–May 2027) vouchers open 1 January 2027

Applications close: 24 May 2027

Vouchers must be used by: 31 May 2027

Sport Voucher Scheme details:

Each eligible child receives two \$100 vouchers per year

Open to children aged 5+, enrolled in an NT school or registered for home-schooling

Vouchers can be used for sport, active recreation, and cultural activities
